Week One:

 May God continue to use experiences like this to provide deeper connections in our faith and practice among students, faculty, and nurses.

• May 3 – We thank God for all he has done over this past year within Nurses Christian Fellowship. We are grateful for the diversity of this ministry and how God has used the *Journal of Christian Nursing*, student and nurse groups, and one-on-one encounters with others. Thank you,

God, for using each of us, broken as we are, to help each other in your love and strength.

Week Two:

- May 4 Pray for nurses as they explore the possibilities of starting a nurse group locally or virtually. We ask God to smooth rough places and remove barriers to starting their groups. Give wisdom and insight as these nurses listen to the needs of other nurses and the call of the Holy Spirit.
- May 5 As we plan NCF's Community Gathering space at <u>Urbana 2025</u>, we ask for prayer to create an environment where nursing students can discern God's call for them in global missions. We pray the Holy Spirit goes ahead of us in drawing nursing students to attend and remove any barriers. We also pray for financial resources to be available so that funds are not a barrier to any nursing students who want to attend Urbana.
- May 6 Pray for our nursing graduates as they continue to prepare to take the NCLEX for licensure. May they have peace during this time of preparation and as they sit for

their boards. We ask for clear thinking. We also pray they remain grounded in their identity in Jesus, regardless of the results of their scores.

- May 7 Praise for feedback from NCF student groups sharing the many ways God has been present! There have been so many nursing students growing in a meaningful relationship with God through the caring and compassionate NCF community.
- May 8 Pray for Katharine Provost, NCF's Associate Student Ministry Director, and Christy Secor, Spiritual Formation and Prayer, as they lead our May <u>Blessing of the</u> <u>Hands</u> event. We ask God to use this event to encourage faculty, students, and nurses working in difficult situations and for those who need to be reminded of their purpose. We ask God to protect the technology during the event and for all that is said to be for his glory.
- May 9 We pray for our children and their children as well. May our children know and experience deep intimacy with God. May they grow in their love and faith. We pray for strength, encouragement, and endurance through the challenges they will face. May they know and live out what it means to store up treasures in Heaven.

- May 21 NCF Next is an outreach to recent nursing graduates as they prepare to enter the nursing profession. Pray for our two sessions today and our speakers as we tackle the issues these graduates often face. Pray also for these graduates to grow in their faith and knowledge as they begin new positions within the nursing profession.
- May 22 Celebrate and praise God for the ways Jesus works through nurses to
 effectively bring needed care and healing to patients throughout the world. Pray that
 nurses can continue to reach and benefit those in need through their daily work and

- May 28 Today is our second of four NCF Next outreaches to recent nursing graduates. Pray for our two sessions today and our speakers as we tackle the issues these graduates often face. Pray also for these graduates to grow in their faith and knowledge as they begin new positions within the nursing profession.
- May 29 Pray that God continues to provide creative thinking and focus to the staff who produce NCF's social media. Ask him to use this outlet to invite more nurses into NCF and to offer information and content that strengthens nurses' work and faith.
- May 30 We praise God for seeds being planted through our student and nurse groups. Remind our student leaders, faculty advisors, and nurse group leaders that their faithfulness makes a difference not only now, but in the years to come for others.
- May 31 We ask God to grant strength and stamina to each member of NCF's staff and the *Journal of Christian Nursing* editorial team. Equip us with his love to do the work of the ministry. May we serve with eyes focused on the eternal and a commitment to continue to dwell in the secret place of the Most High God.
